1.    **1947**           **June 24:** Kenneth Arnold, a civilian pilot, was flying over the Cascade mountains in the vicinity of Mount Rainier, in the state of Washington, when he reported seeing nine shiny objects in a chain-like formation flying at an estimated speed of 1,600 miles per hour. After landing in Pendleton, Oregon, he gave his account to newsmen. He said, "The objects flew like a saucer would if you skipped it across the water."
  
2.           **July 4:** Captain E. J. Smith and First Officer Ralph Stevens were flying their DC-3 airliner over Emmett, Idaho, when they suddenly saw five strange objects in the sky ahead of them. Captain Smith rang for the stewardess for confirmation. The stewardess and the two pilots watched the disks for several minutes. Then four more disks came into sight. The nine disks disappeared after ten minutes. The Air Force quickly denied having anything resembling the objects Captain Smith described.
  
3.    **1948**           **January:** Dayton, Ohio, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. The first UFO project, located within the Air Technical Intelligence Center (ATIC) of Air Material Command, was project Sign, created in January 1948. It was replaced by Project Grudge in February 1949. The project was revitalized under the direction of Captain Edward J. Ruppelt, and the new name was Project Blue Book. Blue Book was charged with investigating and evaluating all UFO reports brought to its attention in the United States.
  
4.           **January 7:** A UFO that looked like "an ice cream cone topped with red" was sighted over Godman Air Force Base, near Fort Knox, Kentucky by several military and civilian observers. Godman Tower requested a flight of four National Guard F-51s which were in the vicinity to investigate the object. Three of the planes closed in on the object and one pilot reported it to be metallic and of "tremendous size." Another pilot described it as "round like a tear drop, and at times almost fluid." The flight leader, Captain Thomas Mantell, reported "I'm going to 20,000 and if I'm no closer, I'll abandon chase." That was the last contact made by Mantell. His decapitated body was found in the wreckage of his plane, later that day.
  
5.           **July 24:** At 2:45 a.m. the pilot and copilot of an Eastern Airlines DC-3, flying at 5,000 feet between Mobile and Montgomery, Alabama, sighted a dull red exhaust ahead of the airliner. Captain Chiles said to copilot Whitted, "Here comes a new Army jet." The object approached in a slight dive, and passed the plane on the right. After passing, it pulled up sharply and disappeared into a cloud. The object was described as a wingless aircraft, 100 feet long, cigar-shaped and about twice the diameter of a B-29.
  
6.           **October 1:** At 9 p.m., Lt. Gorman, flying a P-51 fighter aircraft, saw a fast moving light below his plane. He contacted the tower at Fargo, ND for verification of the

light, and was given permission to pursue. As Lt. Gorman dived at the light, the object made a series of turns, and Gorman pursued. Gorman chased this light for 20 minutes. At the same time the tower operators had the F-51 aircraft and mystery light in full view. The light then climbed out of range and disappeared.

7. **November:** The first Green Fireballs were seen in New Mexico. They became so numerous that the United States Air Force started looking into the mystery. By mid-February 1949, a meeting on the Green Fireballs was called at the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory. Dr. Lincoln La Paz of the University of New Mexico, one of the country's experts in the study of meteors, was appointed to determine what Green Fireballs were. This is when Project Twinkle was formed. From late 1948 through 1952 Green Fireballs were seen throughout the West, but mainly in New Mexico.
8. **1949** **April 24:** At 10:30 a.m. at White Sands Proving Grounds, a large weather balloon was being tracked, both visually and by radar. At 56 miles above the earth, a white egg-shaped object followed the balloon for about one minute. The object made at least one 80 degree turn, then shot straight up and vanished. This was confirmed by four of the tracking personnel on the base.
9. **August 20:** At 10:45 p.m., Professor Clyde Tombaugh, his wife and mother-in-law, while enjoying the evening outside his home in Las Cruces, NM, noticed overhead eight rectangular greenish lights. The lights seemed to be the windows of some object not itself lit up, but vaguely silhouetted against the darkness of the sky. The lights, set in pairs, were about one degree in length. All three witnesses watched the lights disappear over the horizon.
10. **1950** **August 15:** A 16-mm color movie film taken by Nick Mariana from a vacant ball park in Great Falls, Montana, is one of the strongest cases supporting the existence of UFO's. At about 11:25 a.m. a bright flash caught his eye. Mariana could see two bright silvery objects that appeared to be rotating as they flew. He filmed the two circular UFOs as they passed over a building behind a water tower. The objects seemed to flash brightly. In less than 20 seconds the UFOs disappeared.
11. **1951** **August 25:** A group of university professors in Lubbock, TX, spotted a formation of 30 blue-green lights, moving from north to south in the night sky. Carl Hart Jr., a freshman in college took two photographs of the objects on the evening of August 31st as they flew in a perfect "vee" formation. The objects were also observed by many residents, as well as radar operators in the vicinity over a number of days. This encounter became known as the "Lubbock Lights" in ufology.

12. 1952 **July 2:** About 11:00 a.m., seven miles north of Tremonton, Utah, U.S. Navy Warrant Officer Delbert C. Newhouse, with his wife and two children, were driving to his next duty station. He saw and also took 16-mm motion pictures of a formation of objects he could not identify. They appear as small, irregular shapes on the film. Newhouse was quoted as saying that "the UFOs were gunmetal-colored objects shaped like two saucers, one inverted on top of the other."
13. **July 14:** At about 8:10 a.m., Captain William B. Nash and Second Officer William Fortenberry, flying a DC-4 airliner at 8,000 feet, were approaching Norfolk, VA en route to Miami, FL, when both men noticed six bright objects streaking toward the plane. "Their shape was clearly circular" and flying in line" and "about 100 feet in diameter." The objects flew directly underneath their plane as the objects flipped on edge in unison and were joined by two more disks. All eight disks sped away blinking out in sequence.
14. **July 20:** At 12:40 a.m., while eight men were working the control tower radar at Washington D.C., seven "blips" appeared on their scopes. The "blips" changed direction at angles of 90 degrees without decelerating or describing any curve. One object made a 180 degree turn. Jet aircraft were diverted into the area. The pilots could not see anything, as three different radar towers watched. This incident lasted until daybreak. On July 26th the objects returned. This time the UFOs were clocked at speeds of 5,000 miles per hour.
15. **July 29:** Ralph Mayher was visiting some friends in Miami, FL, when at 9:30 p.m. a brilliant object was spotted. Mayher, an experienced photographer, immediately unpacked his movie camera. The object was flying parallel to the horizon, moving quickly over the ocean. Finally the object came into full view and Mayher photographed 40 frames of film. The disk-shaped object then disappeared in a tremendous burst of speed.
16. **September 12:** Flatwoods, West Virginia. About half an hour past sunset four youngsters witnessed what they thought was a meteor land on top of a nearby hill. They rushed back to the house of Mrs. Kathleen May and told her of their sighting. Mrs. May, the four youths and 17-year-old National Guardsman Gene Lemmon went back up the hill to see a red, pulsating object. The object was described as "a big ball of fire" which pulsated. Through the fog on top of the hill they could see a "monster" with a green body and a blood red face with glowing orange eyes. It made a "hissing" sound as it seemed to float back toward the landed object. A strange foul "gas" that was nauseating was also present in the area. The terrified witnesses fled the hillside and called the Braxton County sheriff.

17. **November 20:** George Adamski, with six other witnesses allegedly met a space alien near Desert Center, CA. The alien named Orthon was from Venus. The Venusian began communicating with Adamski by telepathy, informing him the concern over "radiation from our nuclear tests." Adamski claims to have taken photographs of space ships as well as having taken rides on flying saucers. His best selling book "Flying Saucers Have Landed" made him the most famous of all the contactees.
18. 1953 **March 22:** Sara Shaw and Jan Whitley were asleep in an isolated cabin in Tujunga Canyon, CA, when they were awakened by some sort of moving lights out of the bedroom window. They noticed at was 2 a.m. on the clock. Only a fraction of a second passed when Jan noticed over two hours had now passed. Apparently both witnesses suffered a time lapse. Regression hypnosis revealed a classic abduction story. This so-called case was not revealed until 1975 when abduction lore was rife in the United States.
19. **November 23:** On this night, an Air Defense Command radar detected an unidentified "target" over Lake Superior. Kinrose Air Force Base, (now Kinchelde AFB) was closest to the target. They alerted the 433rd Fighter Interceptor Squadron at Truax Field, Madison, WI, and an F-89C interceptor was scrambled. Radar operators watched the "blips" of the UFO and the fighter interceptor merge on their scopes, in an apparent collision, and disappear. No trace of the F-89C aircraft or pilot was ever found.
20. 1954 **July 1:** A UFO was spotted by radar near Rome, NY. An Air Force F-94 was supposedly scrambled from Griffis AFB to intercept it. As the pilot spotted the disk-shaped object near Walesville, NY, it fired a heat ray at the jet, filling the cockpit with unbearable heat. Both the pilot and radar officer baled out. They watched the aircraft continue to fly for several miles before it crashed into Walesville, killing four people on the ground.
21. **October 22:** At 3:15 p.m. in Jerome, Ohio, 60 students, two teachers and the principal were called outside by some students who were outside playing. They all witnessed a cigar-shaped object hanging motionless in the sky. Then "it took off quite rapidly, disappearing in a very short time." It travelled horizontally, leaving a trail in its wake that floated to the ground. Part of the cobweb-like substance fell in long strands and part of it came down in balls similar to cotton. Trees, bushes and wires were covered with the so-called Angel Hair.
22. 1955 **August 21-22:** On a small farm outside Kelly, KY, at about 7 p.m. eight adults and three children had a fantastic experience. One of the men came into the farmhouse saying he saw a flying saucer land near the house. The family dog began barking. Two other men went outside with guns. A

three foot creature (one of several) came at them. As they fired, the creature flipped over backward and ran off into the darkness. One of the other creatures was shot off the roof, another was also shot, flipped over and ran. The creatures continued to make appearances throughout the night. The last one was seen at 5:15 a.m.

23. 1957 **July 17:** A United States Air Force RB-47 aircraft (code "Lacy") equipped with Electronic Countermeasures gear (ECM) and manned by a crew of six were followed by a UFO for about an hour and a half over a distance of more than 700 miles from the Gulf coast of Mississippi, through Louisiana and Texas, and on into southern Oklahoma. The UFO was observed visually by the crew as a brilliant maneuvering light, tracked by ground radar, and detected by the ECM gear on the aircraft.
24. 1958 **October 3:** A Monon railroad freight train, at 3:10 a.m., was crossing through Clinton county, Indiana, when four flattened and brightly glowing lights crossed in front of the train and flew to the rear. The lights followed the train for just over an hour. At one time, the conductor shone a light on the objects, which made them react and fly off. The lights returned to pace the train again. After a couple of minutes the lighted objects flew off and never again returned.
25. 1959 **February 24:** Captain Peter Killian and First Officer James Dee, American Airlines, were flying a DC-6B nonstop from Newark to Detroit. At 8:20 p.m. 13 miles west of Williamsport, PA, at 8,000 feet, they noticed three bright lights off the left wingtip. The lights followed the aircraft for 45 minutes until the plane began letting down for landing in Detroit. The UFOs continuously changed brightness, flashing "brighter than a star." The color fluctuated from yellow-orange to brilliant blue-white.
26. 1960 **August 13:** Two Highway Patrol officers driving east of Red Bluff, CA at 11:00 p.m. sighted an object that they thought was an aircraft about to crash. They jumped out of their car and watched this long metallic-looking object. Attempts to radio for help failed due to strong interference. Huge bright lights on either end of the object swept the area. The object started moving away. They followed this object until it disappeared. Air Force radar confirmed that they were tracking an unknown.
27. 1961 **April 18:** Eagle River, WI. At 11:00 a.m. Joe Simonton heard a strange noise outside. He went out and saw a silvery object land on his farm. He approached the object as a hatch opened and inside he claims he saw three dark-complexioned men "cooking or frying" something on a strange unit. One of the men handed him four cookie-like objects. The UFO then took off and was gone in seconds. He ate one of the "pancakes" and said it tasted like cardboard.



28. 1963 **August 5:** At 11:30 p.m. Ronnie Austin and girlfriend were driving on Route 15, just past the Mount Vernon, IL airport, when a round ball of light kept pace with the car. The light, about the size of an automobile, would slow down or speed up as the car did the same. The light stopped within 200 feet of his car, and then sped off. After Ronnie dropped his girlfriend at home, the light again followed him until he reached his home. He then called the police. The news media picked up the story and relayed it around the world.
29. 1964 **April 24:** Late in the afternoon Socorro, New Mexico patrolman Lonnie Zamora was chasing a speeder in his patrol car when he thought a nearby dynamite storage shed had exploded. Abandoning his chase, he drove off the highway where he observed an egg-shaped object resting on four girder-like legs. Zamora also noted two smallish figures dressed in what he described as coveralls. The object then quickly took off with a roaring noise, scorching a mesquite bush and leaving indentations in the soil.
30. **December 21:** Horace Burns claims to have seen an 80-foot high UFO four miles east of Staunton, VA at 5:00 p.m. Burns claimed the object came down about 100 yards off the highway. He said his car came to an unnaturally quick stop. He said the object rested on the meadow for 90 seconds. Then with a sound of rushing air, it rose straight up and then proceeded into the northeast.
31. 1965 **March 2:** John Reeves, of Brooksville, FL claims he saw a landed flying saucer with a space-suited, robot-like figure nearby. He claims he was hunting snakes around his home when he accidentally discovered the object resting on four landing gear. A five-foot tall figure pointed a small black object at him. He claims he had a conversation with this being. Then the figure entered the craft and flew away. Landing gear impressions as well as footprints were found in the area.
32. **March 15:** James Flynn entered the Everglades with his swamp buggy near Big Cypress Indian Reservation. At 1:00 a.m. he spotted a cone-shaped lighted object hovering just above the ground. He watched through binoculars for 40 minutes. He walked near the object when a beam of light rendered him unconscious. Flynn spent a week in the hospital recovering from burns and eye damage.
33. **August 3:** Shortly after 12:30 p.m. Rex Heflin, an Orange County, CA highway traffic inspector, working in the vicinity of the El Toro Marine Base near Santa Ana, took three photographs with a Polaroid camera of a metallic-looking disk, plus a fourth picture of a smoke ring, which he claimed was left by the disk-shaped object as it flew away. He estimated the object to be 30 feet in diameter.

34. **September 3:** Shortly after 2 a.m. in Exeter, NH, Patrolman Eugene Bertrand received a call from headquarters asking him to pick up a man at the station who had reported a UFO. Bertrand arrived and heard the story from Norman Muscarello. The officer then took Muscarello to the scene. An object was slowly rising from behind some trees. The object had a straight row of bright red lights alternating from left to right. They watched the UFO as it slowly disappeared over some trees.
35. **October 21:** At 6:10 p.m. Arthur Strauch, Deputy Sheriff of Sibley County, MN, in the company of four others was returning from a bow-hunting trip by car, when they spotted a strange disk-shaped object. They were two miles west and two miles north of Saint George. After watching for about ten minutes, Strauch got out of the car and took a photo of the object. The UFO moved at a high rate of speed as it passed over their heads. They also claimed they heard a high-pitched whine.
36. **1966 January 11:** Hundreds of residents of Wanaque, NJ reported observing a strange, large object with a light which maneuvered over the local reservoir. The object was seen from Oakland, Ringwood, Paterson, Totowa, Wayne and Butler. The object was described as "gliding oddly" and changing color from white to red to green and back to white. Witnesses stated that a beam of light from the object melted a large hole in the frozen reservoir.
37. **March 20:** Ann Arbor, MI farmer Frank Mannor and Ronald, his son, were among 24 witnesses who saw a strangely quilted object, with blue and white lights to the front and rear, with a large central searchlight and a small cabin. It was being escorted by four smaller UFOs. They claim the UFO never actually landed but "sat on a base of fog." They say the object was the length of a car and was pulsating. This case led eventually to the "swamp gas" press conference by Air Force UFO consultant Dr. J. Allen Hynek.
38. **April 17:** Early that morning Portage County sheriff's deputies Dale Spaur and "Barney" Neff were investigating an abandoned vehicle near Atwater, Ohio when a huge, domed disk with two blinding searchlights appeared from over a nearby hill. They notified their dispatcher who ordered them to follow it and investigate further. They followed the mystery object at speeds in excess of 90 mph to a point near Freedom, PA where their patrol car ran out of gas. Another deputy was also able to join the chase, and gave a description that matched those of Spaur and Neff.
39. **August 15:** Several thousand people watched unusual lights over Fort Smith, Arkansas. Four red lights, stationary but seeming to rotate, "like a police car warning beacon" were situated in the sky "like points on the corners of a square."

The lights were visible for about three hours, and when they left, they "blinked out" and did not fade away. Crowds of over 1500 people were seen by police. One officer, J.W. Gilbreth, said "what we saw were lights; what they were on, I can't say."

40. **November 1:** The University of Colorado UFO Project officially began on November 1, 1966 and ended on October 31, 1968, under the direction of Dr. Edward U. Condon of the Department of Physics and Astrophysics. It was to conduct a comprehensive investigation into UFO reports. The final report left many UFO incidents unexplained, but the conclusions, written by Condon, were, as predicted by many observers, that UFOs were not worthy of further scientific study.
41. **1967** **January 25:** South Ashburnham, Massachusetts. Betty Andreasson's account tells how five humanoid creatures entered her house through a wooden door by molecular displacement. Her family was placed into a state of suspended animation. She was allegedly taken aboard a craft that looked like two saucers, one on top of the other. She claims to have had a physical examination and given lessons of religious-like experiences.
42. **April 21:** Clifton Crowder, a warehouse manager, left at 9:00 p.m. from South Hill, VA, 75 miles south of Richmond, and started driving home. After a few minutes he saw an object on the road, approximately 12 feet in diameter, sitting on legs about three feet high. He states the object was 16 feet tall and shaped like a water tank. No windows or other physical characteristics were observed. He threw his bright lights on the object and saw a sudden burst of white flame from the object which took off "like a flash." Investigations of the site revealed a burnt area on the road.
43. **December 1:** Mr. and Mrs. James Weidman, who live just north of Hartford, MI, were awakened at about 4:00 a.m. when their dogs began barking profusely. Looking outside they saw a bright object in the sky to the east-northeast. After watching the object for 45 minutes, they called a photographer. It did not twinkle like a star, was brighter than one and was much nearer. State Police were called to the scene and observed the object with binoculars. Three pictures were taken of the object over a span of two hours.
44. **December 3** Just outside of Ashland, Nebraska, police Patrolman Herbert Schirmer reportedly sighted a football-shaped object encircled by red flashing lights, which after a few moments "shot straight out of sight." Schirmer claims to have gone through a 20 minute amnesiac period immediately following the sighting, which was later unlocked during hypnosis. The time-regression hypnosis was performed by Dr. R. Leo Sprinkle for the Colorado UFO Project. Schirmer claims the ufonauts are here to extract electricity from power lines.

45. 1971 **November 2:** In Delphos, Kansas, about 7 p.m., Ronald Johnson was outside when he heard a "rumble" and saw a brightly illuminated object hovering about two feet above the ground. His parents joined him as they saw the UFO departing in the southern sky. The object was about ten feet in diameter, with a bulge in the center that glowed with multi-colored lights. They also saw a glowing area on the ground and also noticed that portions of trees in the area were glowing.
46. 1972 The Yakima Earthlight phenomenon has been a continuous nocturnal event for many years. The phenomenon is generally located in and around the Yakima Indian Reservation, east of Mt. Rainier in Washington state. These lights are unusual, yet well documented. Forestry lookouts at the reservation reported more than 80 cases between 1972 and 1977, and photographs of the phenomena have been taken. Many times UFOs were also seen. The lights seem blue-white as they originate, and then fade through yellow to dull red before disappearing.
47. 1973 **October 12:** Charles Hickson and Calvin Parker were fishing from a pier at the Shaupeter shipyard in Pascagoula, Mississippi, when at 7:00 p.m. Hickson turned around and saw a UFO 25 to 30 yards behind them. They watched as a hatchway opened in the object as three entities floated out. They were both allegedly floated into the UFO. Lie detection tests, and questioning never solved this event.
48. **October 18:** Captain Lawrence Coyne and his Army helicopter crew had a close encounter with a cigar-shaped UFO 60 miles north-east of Mansfield, Ohio. The object was about 60 feet long and had a grey metallic hull, and seemed to have a central dome. The object, with a red light in front and a green light in the rear, caused the helicopter to climb 1800 feet, although the controls were set for a 20 degree dive. Two additional witnesses on the ground have finally come forward to verify the case.
49. 1975 **November 5:** Six woodcutters, along with their employer, were heading home after working in the Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest, AZ in a truck. They saw an object glowing off the road. Travis Walton jumped out and approached the object. A blue-green beam shot out from the object striking Walton. The others fled the area in fear. They finally turned back only to find that Walton disappeared. Five days later Walton was found in Heber, AZ. His abduction and experience is related in his book, "The Walton Experience."
50. 1976 **January 23:** A large, lighted cigar-shaped object was reported by hundreds of persons in Clovis, NM. In addition, scores of other calls came into the police, radio and television stations that evening from people sighting up to 20 UFOs at a time. A photograph taken by a newsman of one of

the cigar-shaped objects confirmed the nature of the sighting.

51. **October 2:** A mysterious "flying box" was sighted at Weaverville, CA at 8:00 p.m. by a man who went outside his home to quiet some noisy cats in his yard. A deputy officer was dispatched to the scene, and both witnesses described the object a "square with bright lights on the corners." The UFO seemed to hover at about 2000 feet. About five minutes later the object left the area at a high speed.
52. **1977** **January 10:** Thomas Mc Carthy of Wakefield, NH observed that the frozen surface of his pond started to melt. The temperature outside was five degrees above zero. He with his wife and son looked into the hole and saw a black square object. In a short time, after notifying the police, some Civil Defense personnel arrived. Three days later, after removing the object, Governor Meldrim Thompson announced that nothing had been found and that the alleged mystery was officially over.
53. **1978** **August 8** Joseph Staudinger, his wife, and their son, were sitting on their front porch in Belton, MO, a suburb south of Kansas City. It was about 9:40 p.m. when they first noticed a light moving slowly toward their house. Mrs. Staudinger ran to her neighbors, and they too watched this "white light with a reddish glow with strobe lights flashing underneath" for about 45 minutes. The Gebaur Air Force Base tower also saw the object. The object was also picked up on radar at Kansas City International Airport more than 30 miles away.
54. **1980** **December 29:** Vickie Landrum, her grandson and their friend Betty Cash were driving towards Dayton, Texas when they witnessed a huge glowing object descend to treetop height above the road in front of them. They stopped the car and got out to see what was happening. The UFO appeared to be generally diamond-shaped with long flames bursting down from below. Helicopters were seen and heard in the area. The after-effects of the sighting have been horrific. The witnesses were subjected to some form of radiation poisoning.
55. **1981** **February 5:** Nine people gathered at a farmhouse in Duncannon, PA saw a huge "rumbling" object at about 7:00 p.m. "It was shaped like a boomerang and had at least five lights on the back and several more on the front," said on the witnesses. The object was described as being three to four times the size of a jet aircraft, and was moving much slower than any normal aircraft.
56. **November 28:** At 9:00 p.m. police in Martin County, NC received a call that an oval-shaped object was hovering over a local shopping center. The object was said to have emitted a white light and at times would hover at tree-top heights. The witness reportedly followed the UFO at 65 mph until the object hovered over the shopping center. Another or same object was sighted in Hamilton, NC at 9:10 p.m.

57. 1982 **November 12:** Three witnesses riding in a car near Victoria, Texas reported sighting a dark, oval or saucer-shaped unknown object at about 6:00 p.m. They then pulled into a local grocery store where three additional people were found to have had the same experience. The mysterious object was completely soundless, and was in full view for over five minutes.
58. **December 11:** Three vacationers riding on snowmobiles sighted an unknown object shaped like an inverted saucer in the Chomstick Valley in Washington state at about 5:50 p.m. They claimed it was outlined in clear white lights, and that the object was rounded on top and flat on the bottom. The UFO seemed to have two smaller objects following it that were marked by red lights. The witnesses watched the object for over 40 minutes before the cold weather forced the party to leave the area.
59. 1983 **January 11:** Three people in Stapleton, Alabama at about 7:00 p.m., reported sighting a saucer-shaped object with blue lights on its upper portion with a piercing white light on the top pointed upwards. The object emitted a low humming sound and was no more than 50 to 60 feet above the ground. The object hovered for several minutes before slowly moving away towards the northeast.
60. **July 11:** Hundreds of people in Pikesville, KY reported sighting a triangular-shaped object at 7:00 p.m. The slowly moving mystery object was reported to have had four yellow lights and two red lights. At one point the triangular object hovered over a baseball stadium, suspending the game for five minutes while players and spectators watched before the mystery object glided out of sight.
61. 1984 **January 21:** A strange object landed in a field near Presbyterian College in Clinton, SC at about 12:05 a.m. The mystery object, described as a "light, 18 to 24 inches in diameter," was seen by five students, two college security guards and two local police officers. As the police arrived on the campus and approached the mysterious lighted object, it took off and headed towards the east.
62. Rachel, Nevada, on Highway 375, about 150 miles north of Las Vegas, is a town near a highly restricted area. The area is the Nellis Range and the Nevada Test Site. This area is referred to as Area-51 or the Groom Lake Test Area. Since 1984 residents and visitors to this area claim that the USAF is testing flying saucers or have objects from other worlds that they are flying. Many weird stories have come from this location, including the secret aircraft the "Aurora."
63. 1987 **February 3:** Three Gleason, WI girls reported to the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department that they saw a UFO at about 6:45 p.m. They claim the object was a large round thing that was yellow and white in color but later changed to blue.

The object had red flashing lights with some sort of sparks coming from the rear as it flew across the sky.

64. **May 11:** In Glenwood Springs, CO residents spotted two bright lights, pulsating and alternating in color from red to green to white. Glenwood springs police officers trained binoculars and spotting scopes on the mystery lights. The lights were viewed for a half an hour by police officers and residents before the lights disappeared.
65. **June 16:** Several witnesses, including a deputy sheriff, sighted a low-level UFO near the town of Citra, FL. Stephanie James and her three children, as well as her sister, were sitting in her car on Pine Church Road when they first spotted the object. She described it as being the size of a car with what looked like headlights and one red light and a blue or green light on its front. They also described seeing auto-sized wheels at the back. They left when it got about 50 feet from them. Deputy Jay Manifold reported seeing a similar object flying some 30 feet above the ground "for only a few seconds."
66. **1988** **January 15:** Debbie Plonsky of Cannon Falls, MN was driving one-half mile north of White Rock when she spotted a glowing florescent pink "something" at about 7:40 a.m. Her five-year-old daughter also witnessed the unusual object. "It was the shape of the spaceships you see in cartoons, with a cap on top. There was nothing fuzzy or blurry about it," Plonsky added. It was as long as two barns, she estimated, and so she stopped her car to have a better look at it. As soon as she did her car radio stopped. She observed it for some 15 minutes when it disappeared straight up leaving a vapor trail. Her car radio worked as soon as the UFO left.
67. **1989** East of Marfa, and west of Alpine, TX, is an area called Mitchell Flat. In this area the mystery lights sometimes called "spook lights," or "Marfa Lights" or the "West Texas Mystery Lights," have been seen and recorded since the times of the Indians. 1983 marked 100 years of recorded history of the lights. But not until the mid-1980s have scientists taken them seriously. So far, there have been 24 different explanations for the lights. In 1989, a Japanese film crew tried to explain the phenomena, but failed. The lights have a simple, mysterious beauty all their own.
68. **January 30:** Elaine Goldman along with her sister and aunt were driving on I-80 near Battle Mountain, NV at about 5:00 p.m. when they saw a large star-like object in the distance. As they drew nearer, they realized that it was hovering motionless over the highway. "We were close enough to it to tell that it wasn't an airplane or helicopter," Goldman said. They described the UFO as "kind of oval in shape," and bathed in a red glow. Two short streams of smoke emanated from the center of the oval. It

also had flashing red lights on both sides of the oval. After keeping the object in view for 10-15 minutes "It just disappeared."

69. 1990 **November 9:** Frank Perkins was on his way back to his house near Brookings, Oregon after feeding his livestock when he spotted an unusual object. It was so bright that it hurt his eyes, and was completely soundless. Perkins said it was turning around and around in the cloudless sky. He described it as being bright silver with windows and a domed top. It then took off above some trees and across the Chetko River. He was certain that it wasn't any kind of aircraft, nor weather phenomena.
70. 1991 **April 2:** Dick Feichtinger, a movie theater owner in Fari-bault, Minnesota saw an object "that was oblong, but seemed to be hanging up and down. Rather than horizontal, it was vertical." Feichtinger, who was on his way to work at about 7:00 p.m., described the UFO as white, and very long and narrow. Later, as he was heading home, he saw it again. This time it was red and green. He continued to track the object until he arrived home. He called his wife and children, and they too saw it. He called several neighbors to come out and view it, and they all said that the object was red and green, and seemed to be guided by some intelligence. They also noticed the sudden appearance of what seemed to be military aircraft, flying at a very low altitude.
71. 1992 **October 26:** A Glendale, CA woman and her 13-year-old son sighted a UFO at 9:30 p.m. that "was dark gray, shaped like a triangle. It was flat, and at each of the three corners it had a flashing red light." They both described the mystery object as huge in size, and emitting a low hum. They said it at first seemed to be heading downward about to crash, but it quickly gained altitude and was lost to sight by trees in the distance.
72. 1993 **July 12:** A woman and her husband from Wysox Township, PA were in their swimming pool at 12:45 a.m. when they spotted an unusual object. She explained that the object they saw in the sky had three round white lights in front and it moved with a rolling motion from left to right - back and forth - while traveling straight. It sounded like a jet roaring, and they also noted that there were no flashing lights like on an airplane.
73. 1994 **September 27:** About half a dozen workers at the E.P.A.'s Motor Vehicle Emissions Lab in Ann Arbor, Michigan said they saw a UFO flying in the pre-dawn sky. Scott Wilson said he noticed a green bar of light "about an inch long and a quarter-inch wide" in the north sky. Wilson and a security guard directed other workers arriving for work at 5:00 a.m. to the object. The light would disappear



as clouds moved across the sky then reappear, and at one time a small plane seemed to fly beneath it. The UFO was in view for some 15-20 minutes.

74. 1995

**June 16:** Mrs. Morris Moore of Walker Springs, Alabama reported that a UFO hovered over her home at 11:20 p.m. making a "terrible racket." She proceeded to wake up her husband as the object began making a "suction sound." They went out to investigate, and found that the UFO was hovering over a 40 acre field at treetop level. They noted that it had a "round red glowing light" on top. "It rattled the dishes and the whole house shook," Mrs. Moore said. "The cows even went to bellowing."

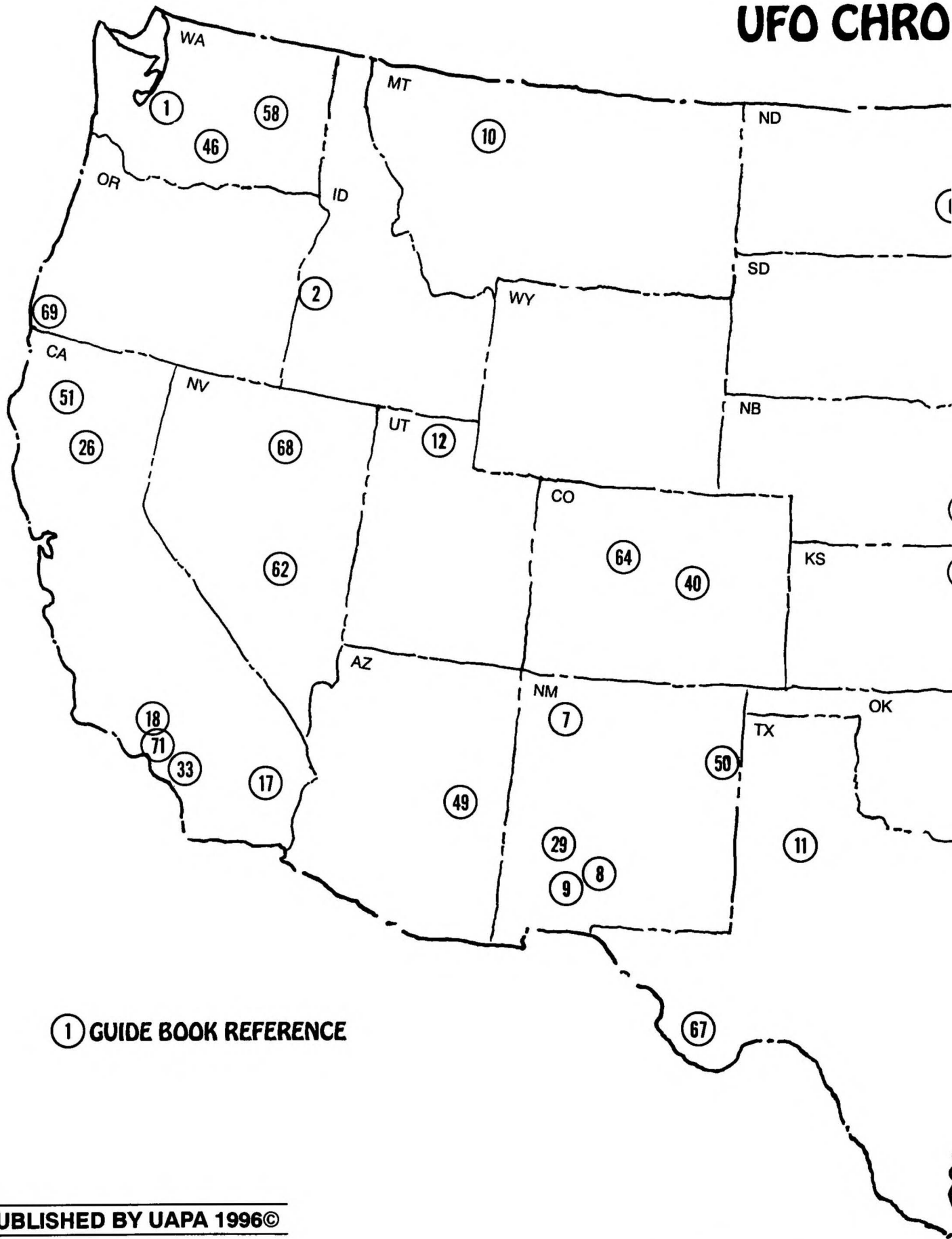

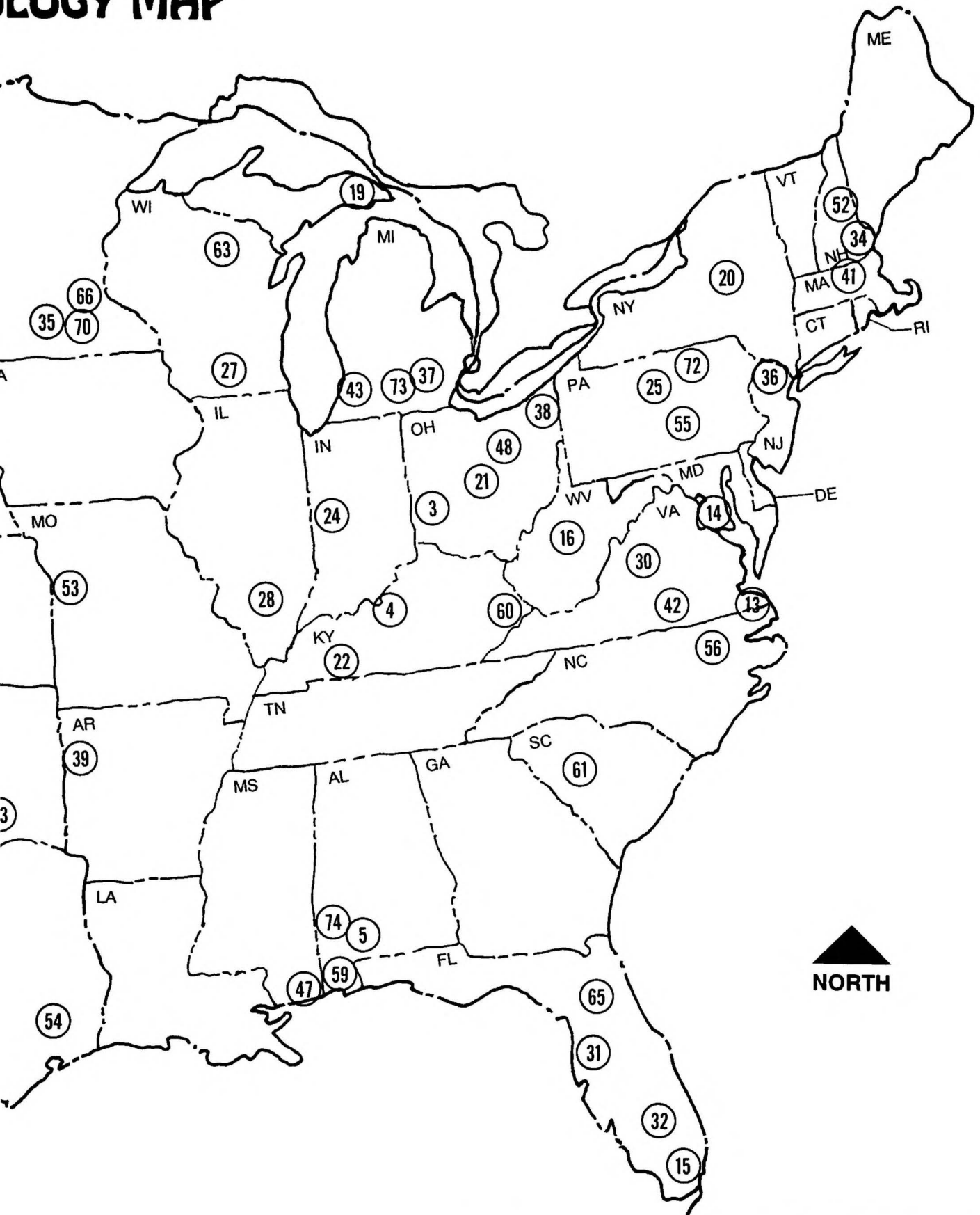
